GENERAL LETTER (NOVEMBER 2025)

Dear Middle School and Senior High School Parents,

As the month concludes, here are the amazing events, and important reminders for the upcoming month.

Cambridge IGCSE & AS/A Level Examination Orientation for Grade 10 & 11

On 1 November 2025, the school held an Orientation Program designed for Cambridge IGCSE (Grade 10) and AS/A Level (Grade 11) to prepare students and parents for the international curriculum, examination expectations, and success strategies. Vice Principal Ms. Rama Sharma outlined the curriculum and exam requirements, emphasizing resilience, discipline, and the importance of parental support. Parents were urged to provide consistent guidance, monitor progress, and promote a balanced lifestyle, while an interactive Q&A clarified grading, coursework, and exam schedules. The session boosted student confidence, reassured parents, and strengthened the school-family partnership as both groups prepared to embrace the challenges and opportunities of the Cambridge pathway.



Visit to Soka Gakkai Cultural Centre Exhibition on Civilization Between Gus Dur and Daisaku Ikeda

On 3 November 2025, Grade 10 students visited the Soka Gakkai Cultural Centre to attend the “*Dialogue of Civilizations for Tolerance and Peace*” exhibition, which highlighted the friendship and shared vision of Abdurrahman Wahid (Gus Dur) and Daisaku Ikeda. Students toured displays of letters, photographs, and writings, participated in a guided discussion on dialogue as a means of bridging cultural and religious differences, and reflected on Gus Dur’s promotion of pluralism, Ikeda’s philosophy of peace through education, and the role youth can play in fostering tolerance. Many expressed admiration for the leaders’ courage and dedication, and the visit deepened their understanding of interfaith dialogue and the educational value of cultural centres.

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EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIP

The Jogjakarta field trip from 5–9 November 2025 for Grades 7 and 12 combined learning, culture, and adventure.
